Longtime Grove resident Betty Belle Hinkle died Thursday, January 13, 2022, in Miami, Oklahoma. She was 95.

Mrs. Hinkle was born June 21, 1926, in Southern California to Floyd and Blanche Roden. Growing up in Ontario, California, she graduated from Chaffee High School and attended Chaffee College, the oldest community college in California. She married Euler Henderson Hadley in 1945.
