Bill/Dad/Gramps' most important accomplishment came in the form of many red-heads - Ginger, Kody, Cade, Finn. His children, Billy & Tadd, were his pride & joy. The grandchildren were the light of his world.

He always held Ginger on a pedestal & showed us all how a woman should be treated.

Dr. Bill Joe Pearish, 59, of Grove and a long time Fairland Public Schools and Northeastern A&M

Instructor passed away surrounded by his family Friday, February 13, 2015.

He was born on February 26, 1955 in Joplin, Missouri to Forrest Eugene and Elizabeth Marie (Hall) Pearish. May 27, 1978 in Webb City, Missouri he married his wife of thirty-six years Ginger Gail Rogers. Bill worked for Wal-Mart as a store manager in several states while attending Missouri Southern State College where he received his bachelor's degree. He later attended Northeastern State University to attain his Master's Degree, then Oklahoma State University for his Doctorate. He and Ginger moved to Grove in 1992, that is when he started his teaching career at Fairland Public Schools. He had also been an adjunct professor at Rogers State University for a short period of time and had taught at Northeast Oklahoma A&M College for many years also. In Dr. Pearish's early years he started as a Golden Glove Boxer and worked his way into being a professional. He still hit the heavy bag every day at the house. Everyone that knew Doc Pearish or Heavy P knew he was a Duke Basketball Fanatic; he also enjoyed reading, fishing and spending time with his family. Dr. Pearish was preceded in passing by his father Forrest Eugene Pearish, an infant sister Betty Jean Pearish, his sister Juanita Pearish and a granddaughter Avery Pearish.
