Charles Douglas Oexman, 75, a lifetime Miami resident, passed away on Wednesday, October 8, 2025, at Freeman Health System in Joplin, Missouri. Charles was born on November 15, 1949, in Miami to Herman and Audrey (Miller) Oexman. He graduated from high school with Miami High School Class of 1968. He then attended Oklahoma State University until joining the United States Air Force in 1970.
