Maxine Womack of Oswego, Kansas left for her journey home at the Chetopa Manor in Chetopa, Kansas on February 5, 2010. Maxine was proud of her Lutheran faith, having been an original charter member of the Mt. Olive Lutheran Church in Miami, Oklahoma. She spent most of her adult life in the Oklahoma towns of Miami, Fairland, and Picher. She lived in Colorado for a brief time from 1983 to 1987. Her later years she resided in the Kansas towns of Parsons, Altamont, and Oswego.

She was married to Fred "Bus" Womack on September 26, 1937 and had two children; Alice Caldwell Banzet and Dan Womack. Maxine worked for 32 years at the King Louis Mfg.
