



## Dixie Pauline Eulitt

March 6, 1924 - June 24, 2017

Dixie Pauline Eulitt, a longtime area resident passed away on Saturday, June 25, 2017 at Eastwood Manor in Commerce, she was ninety-three. 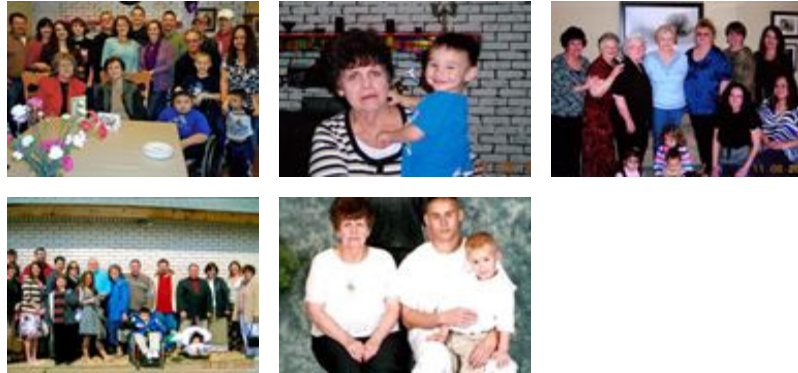
