



Earle F. Hollis

August 15, 1935 - April 14, 2020

Earle F. Hollis passed away on April 14, 2020 at his home in Georgetown, Texas, at the age of 84, while in the arms of his loving wife, Aggie.

Born on August 15, 1935 in Cardin, Oklahoma, Earle was raised in Miami, OK and was a member of the Cherokee Nation.

After graduating from Oklahoma University and a brief stint teaching in Joplin, MO, Earle went to work at the Special School District of St. Louis County, from which he retired as Assistant Superintendent in 1980 after being diagnosed with hemochromatosis. He successfully battled this disease for years, only to succumb to a recent encounter with Atypical Parkinson's. Through it all, he brightened the days of nurses and doctors with his sense of humor. Earle often left behind health care staff howling with laughter.

Earle had many interests. He was a star on the country western dance floor which is where he met Aggie; as with everything else, his dance moves put a smile on people's faces. He was an avid reader and very knowledgeable of Civil War history. He would recite a poem out of the blue that he learned as a teenager. He was a dog lover, a horseman, and outdoorsman. Earle, otherwise known as "Ozark Slim," had a circle of hunting and fishing buddies who got together for fishing, duck hunting on the Missouri River, elk hunting on horseback in Idaho, turkey hunting in Missouri and Arkansas, and annual

deer hunting in Arkansas where he was a member of the Lockett Deer Club with a group of very special friends.

Earle was a special man who was loved and enjoyed by everyone he met. He left behind a multitude of friends wherever he lived, in St. Louis and Eureka, MO, in Ramona, CA, in rural Oklahoma near Okmulgee, and in his latest home in Georgetown, TX as he granted Aggie's wish to get back to Texas. He was born the same day Will Rogers died and followed the philosophy that he never met anyone he did not like, and also saying a stranger is just a friend you haven't yet met. He was a one-of-a-kind, brilliant, and kind man, funny-as-hell. He was quite the character and will be dearly missed.

Earle was preceded in death by his parents, Perry and Eva Hollis; his brother Jerry Hollis; and his nephew, Steve Hollis.

He leaves behind his wife of 28 years, Aggie Hollis; son, Steve Hollis and wife, Sally Becker, of Columbia, MO; son, Matt Hollis and wife, Becka, of Cape Girardeau, MO; his adorable granddaughters: Maci, Briley, and Marley Hollis, of Cape Girardeau; and equally adorable grandson, Gus Hollis of Columbia; nieces, Cindy Brown and Ann Hollis; great nephews, Keith and Kevin Brown; and great niece, Sarah Hollis.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Earle's funeral will be limited to private graveside services for family in Miami, OK on Monday April 20, 2020.
