Former Associate Professor and Academic Affairs Director of Technical and Occupational Programs, Oklahoma State University, Edwin S. Darby passed away Monday, September 25. Born on October 11, 1932 in Seminole County, Oklahoma. The son of Willis Foster and Bessie Deoria Kerns Darby. He attended public schools in Perkins and Stillwater, graduating from Stillwater High School in 1950.

He enlisted in the U.S. Naval Reserve in 1949 and was activated during the Korean Conflict in 1951 and discharged in 1953 following service as a Plane Captain in Naval Aviation.

He received the Technical Certificate in Aeronautical Technology in 1955. Following employment with the airlines and Federal Aviation Agency, he returned to OSU to teach and complete BS, MS, and EdD degrees in Technical and Occupational Education Administration.

He is survived by his wife, Ramona Carolyn (Taylor) Darby and two daughters Charissa Lynn Phipps and husband Douglas of Lander, Wyoming; Michele Diane Beard and husband Dennis of Fairland, Oklahoma; Daughter-in-law Susan R. Darby of Goose Creek, South Carolina; six grandchildren Kristen D. and Jesse Dialessi, Courtney L. Phipps, Danielle M. and Daniel Hayden, Alexis M. and Eric L. Smith, Chad F. Darby, Kelsey S. Darby and one great granddaughter. He was preceded in passing by a son, Chris Edwin Darby, his parents, a brother, Franklin E. Darby, two sisters, Leta M. Smith and Evelyn A. Westfall.

His Zest for life, displayed by the products of his workshop, was exceeded only by the love of his wife of sixty-two years, his children and families and his belief in Jesus Christ. 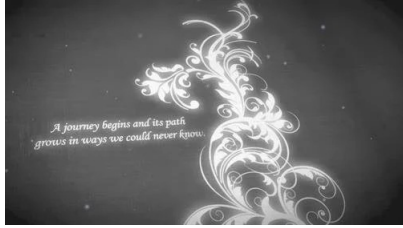
The family has asked that memorial contributions be made to the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation.
