Gladys Marie Saenz, 98, a longtime resident of Miami, Oklahoma, passed away on Wednesday, February 25, 2026, at Integris Grove Hospital. She also loved swimming. She took the family to the Miami City pool to swim and was the oldest student at the NEO aquatic center, swimming into her nineties. She is preceded in passing by her parents, Kirby and Ila Staton, her husband of 42 years, Mario Saenz, son, Danny Saenz, son-in-law, Jack Jackson, and siblings Pauline Wilson and Kenneth Staton.
