Glenda F. (Brewer) Highland, born September 26, 1920 at Covington, Oklahoma to Charles E. and Polly A. (Harman) Brewer. They moved to Oklahoma City in 1922. Glenda graduated from Central High School and Hill's Business College in Oklahoma City. On June 18, 1939 she married John E. Highland MD, they moved to Miami, Oklahoma on September 26, 1946 where he established his medical practice until 1980. Glenda was a member of First Christian Church in Miami, she was an active member and past president of chapter DR-PEO Sisterhood and Letters and Arts Club and several bridge clubs.
