After high school he spent two years at Kemper Military College in Boonville, MO. On June 17, 1943, Frank entered the US Army Air Force and served during WWII in the South Pacific on Sipan. After his discharge on March 4, 1946 Frank returned to Oklahoma and attended Tulsa University, Tulsa, Ok. He then went into business with his father at Tri State Lumber Company which consisted of five locations. On April 25, 1948, Frank was united in marriage to Mildred Mills in Grove, Ok. In July of 1968, the family moved to Chamberlain, SD where they purchased Chamberlain florist which they owned for over 25 years. After retirement, they continued to make their home in Chamberlain. He enjoyed reading and hunting.

Frank was a member of the V.F.W. the American Legion, and the United Church of Christ in Chamberlain. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge and Big Bend Shrine Club raising funds for children.

Frank passed away on February 11, 2011 at Sanford Medical Center in Chamberlain at the age of 87 years. Gratefully sharing his life are his wife Mildred Reniker of Chamberlain; son Jay F. Reniker and wife Susie of Sugarland, TX; June K. TenEyck and husband Ronald of Rowlett, TX; and three grandchildren Allison, Michael and Jeffrey.
