Kathleen Hamilton of Miami, Oklahoma passed away August 15, 2015 at Grove Nursing Center in Grove, Oklahoma. She was 90 years young.

Kathleen was born May 24, 1925, in Miami, Oklahoma to Sherman and Beulah (Brewer) Staton. She lived in the Miami area her entire life. She graduated from Miami High School in 1943. Kathleen was also a proud member of the Peoria Tribe of Oklahoma.

Kathleen had passionate zest for life. She began working at Security Bank and Trust in 1949 and worked there for 63 years before finally retiring in 2012. Kathleen wore many hats in her lifetime. She was a 50+ year member of Pilot International and a past president.
