and enjoying the outdoors. When in Maryland, she was fond of gardening, researching her family's genealogy, and visiting the beach.

She leaves behind many happy memories that family and friends hold dear in her absence. Meg was an independent spirit with an enormous heart and wonderful sense of humor. She was brave, generous, loyal, and kind. She was clever and full to the brim with knowledge gained with all her life experiences. Throughout her life, there wasn't much she couldn't do when she set her mind to it – she was a brown belt in karate, earned her real estate license, learned to ride a motorcycle, these were just a few of her accomplishments.
