Mavis Belva Davis was born August 6, 1924 on a small farm near the town of Lamasco, Texas and the Red River. She passed away on December 14, 2022 in Rancho Palos Verdes, California at the age of 98. She was preceded in death by her parents, Erman and Oline Doan, a brother, Jack Doan, and her husband, Ira Davis.

She moved to Miami, Oklahoma with her parents when she was 15. There she met and married Ira Davis. They lived 3 miles east of Miami in the Elm Creek Community for over 65 years. She was a founding member of the Eastview Church of Christ, and later a member of Bethany Christian Church of Miami and the First Christian Church of Torrance, California. Mrs. Davis was a faithful church goer throughout her life. She was also very active in the community, holding leadership positions in several rural clubs and winning awards for her service. Mrs. Davis spent 15 years as an employee of the JC Penny Company as well.

Her family was all-important to her. She is survived by her sister, Mary Dorlene (Green) Diebold of Dallas, Texas; a son Richard (Louise); two grandsons, Scott (Kelly), Kurt (Maddie); and two great grandsons, Lincoln and Walker, all of California; sister-in-law, Wanda Doan of Grove, Oklahoma; and several cousins, nieces and nephews.
