Myrtle L. Moore, 93, a resident of Miami passed away on Thursday, May 16, 2013 in Poteau, Oklahoma. Mrs. Moore was born on September 14, 1919 in Afton, Oklahoma to John Theodore and Effie Viola (Gray) Dent. Myrtle graduated high school in 1937, then she married Taylor Moore on March 7, 1947, he precedes her in passing. Mrs. Moore worked at Day and Zimmerman Ammunition Plant in Parson, Kansas mostly putting primers in the ammunition for seventeen years. After retirement she worked at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College in the Cafeteria. Myrtle was preceded in passing by her parents John and Effie Dent, her husband Taylor, her brothers and sisters, Essie Pridgen, Opal Leora Tunnell, Beulah Ruby Woody, Iva Augustine Stark and Paul Monroe Dent.
