Orville C. Macklin, 92, of Miami passed away Friday, February 5, 2016 at Higher Call Nursing Center in Quapaw. He was born on April 25, 1923 in Racine, Wisconsin to Roy and Francis Macklin. O.C. joined the Army Air Corps, where he worked as a Belly Gunner. He worked for the B.F. Goodrich Tire Plant in Miami for thirty-eight years, although he loved his work he spent many years supporting local Veterans. He was a member of the American Legion for over sixty years, during which time he was the Commander of Post #147, he was a service officer, and he formed the Veterans Funeral Detail and the Holiday Flag Program. He was very proud that he had provided honors to 1352 veterans over his years on the Funeral Detail. He worked very closely for many years on the Boys State program for the American Legion and was a member of the 40 and 8, and held several positions with them. Mr. Macklin loved his family, he enjoyed fishing, traveling and camping with them. O.C. was preceded in passing by his wife Lillian (Phillips) Macklin, a grandson Brian Newman, a wife Beth Macklin and a son-in-law Tom Hite along with his brothers and sisters.

Survivors include a son Steve Macklin and his wife Kathy of Afton, daughters Teri Hite of Bentonville, Judee Snodderly and her husband Chris of Miami and Cindy Roberts of Tucson, Arizona, step sons Curtis McVay and his wife Debra, Mike McVay and a step daughter Kim (Grover) Smith. 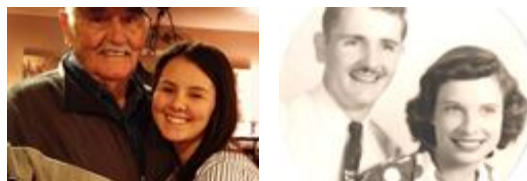

“ I grew up next door to the Macklins. Orville (that is what we called him, not O.C) was larger than life to me. He worked at the BFG plant and was in great shape with a finely chiseled chest and arms from building tires. In the summer, before air conditioning all the neighbors sat on the porches and talked way into the night. While the adults visited we kids played in the yard. Orville brought in a huge off-road tire inner tube that he had inflated to about 3/4 and set it in his front yard. We had a contest each night to set the record for how far we could fly across the yard by being catapulted from that inner tube when he jumped on the other side. Once, after winning an aluminum boat in a raffle he outfitted it with a steering wheel and motor big enough to pull neighborhood kids on a homemade surfboard attached to the back of the boat. We roared up and down Spring River for hours on that surfboard and he just drove the boat and laughed as we fell off. I could go on and on with memories of Orville. He was quite a guy, and a big part of my fond childhood memories of our neighborhood. He was a WWII veteran of the Army Air Forces, being a crew member on an A-20 aircraft. He was part of the "Greatest Generation". R.I.P Orville Macklin.
