“ Pat was my friend. She grew up across from our home on Coal Creek in Ottawa County, Oklahoma. Our fathers were gentlemen farmers and cattlemen, a breed of men now fading into history.. When my sister and I came to live on the farm in 1952, Pat told me many years later, that she was unhappy because my daddy used to play with her and now he had his own little girls to play with. She was older than me and played in different circles and we really did not link up again for many years. Life took us each here and there until we came together again working as psych nurses at Hawthorne in St. John's in Joplin. Pat shared so many stories of my little years and our fathers sharing the trials of ranching and helping each other with anything that needed doing on the land. I grew up hearing my father talk about his good friend? Perry Hauser. The stories reached me no matter where we lived throughout our years in the military, told with humor and passion by my father.
