She liked playing games, playing skip-bo with the grandkids, and in her younger days, she loved pulling pranks on people. She had a contagious laugh that made it difficult not to have fun around her. She always made others feel welcome and spent her life doing for others. She especially loved holidays and made each one a special occasion.
