She was an extremely kind and generous person. When she lived in Okmulgee for many years, and since I resided in OKC, she spent a great deal of time helping and being a true friend to my grandmother. She helped with her banking, going to the store and doctor, and even going out to play bingo. I traveled to Okmulgee on most weekends to visit my grandmother and Darlene.

We spoke often about her coming down to stay with me a while to get some relaxation from the stresses in her life.

The one truly remarkable trait that Darlene had that I would like everyone to know about is how truly empathetic she was. She was an absolute Godsend to me. I've been through a rough patch of depression this past year and Darlene - always without exception - would get me through some rough times. She was a very good listener and could really calm me down. She knew just how to coax me out of my funks. We spoke practically every night and

sometimes we spoke for hours on end. I can honestly say if Darlene had not been there and been a wonderful support system for me, I would not be amongst the living. I will always be grateful for her support and non-judgmental ways with me.

These are only but a few things about Darlene that set her apart from so many other people. I could go on and on about the time we spent together. I consider myself extremely blessed to have had her in my life.
