Perry Lee Isley, 82, passed away Sunday, December 17, 2017 in the home. He was born in Hiwassee, Arkansas on May 18, 1935 to the late Elmer and Ethel (Rotramel) Isley. He attended grade school in Gravette, Arkansas and high school in Porterville California. He served in the Air Force from 1954-1958.
