Roger Dee Oakley, 60, of Overland Park, KS, died at 11:30 PM, Sunday, January 24, 2016 at Brookdale College Square in Overland Park, KS. He was born April 20, 1955 in Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Elmer L. Oakley and Imogene B. Jones.

Roger was survived by his mother Imogene Jones of Afton, OK, brother Terry (Debbie) Oakley of Sugar Land, TX, daughters Jessica Handy of Cleora, OK, Kristy Lloyd of Owasso, OK, Brandie Disbrow of Sand Springs, OK, sons Richard Oakley of Sand Springs, OK, Justin (Mackenzie) Oakley and two granddaughters of Olathe, KS, and several other grandchildren, uncles, aunts, nieces, nephews, cousins, and many friends.
