November 4, 1950 - October 11, 2024

Stanley Eugene Willcox, 73, a longtime Miami resident passed away on Friday, October 11, 2024 at St. John Hospital in Tulsa Oklahoma after a brief illness. He was born on November 4, 1950 in Pawhuska Oklahoma to Leroy Americus and Pauline (Miller) Willcox. Stan graduated from Pauls Valley high school. He started working with Lone Star Gas in Sulphur, Oklahoma and moved to Miami to work for Oklahoma Natural Gas as a welder. After a long career of over 40 years with ONG Stan retired as the manager of the Mima office. Following his retirement, Stan worked for Osborn Drug as a delivery man... A job he loved! Stan very much enjoyed making others happy, volunteering with numerous church ministries, foreign exchange kids, Horses Of Hope and harp roadie for Tammy. When asked if he also played a musical instrument his standard reply was "I can carry any instrument she buys!" Stan enjoyed working with metal and welding works of art. He embodied the scripture Micah 6:8. To do what is right, to love, kindness, and walk with humility with your God. Stan's family stated that he loved rust. He would take metal items and make art out of them by welding items together. He and his wife that he doted over, Tammy (Peery) Willcox, enjoyed their rural home with their animals. Stan enjoyed working outside and of course in his shop building where he and his friends could be seen in their rocking chairs eating peanuts and throwing the shells on the floor. Stan and Tammy enjoy their church family and to many of Tammy's piano students Stan was a grandfather figure. Preceding Stan in passing were his mother, Pauline Willcox who passed when

Stan was a young boy, his dad Leroy, his mom who raised him, Nadean (Conrad) Willcox , brother Roy Willcox, nephew Doug Willcox and his baby daughter Dena Nichole.
