Thomas “Tom” Staton Pogue, 79, a longtime Miami resident and rancher, passed away Thursday, December 2, 2021, at Mercy Hospital in Joplin, Missouri. Tom was born on June 16, 1942, in Miami to James K. and Lena Beryl (Staton) Pogue. Mr. Pogue was a Veteran of the United States Army. Tom was a horse guy. 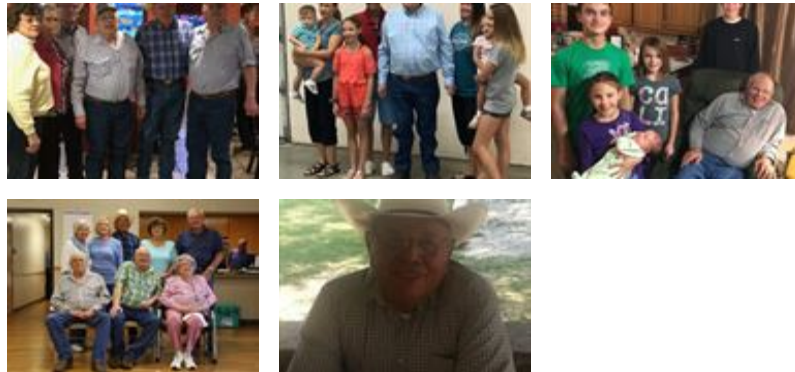
