Thomas "Tommy" Wayne Spicer, 81, a longtime Miami resident passed away Tuesday, August 2, 2016 at Windridge Care and Rehab in Miami. Tommy was born on May 12, 1935 in Miami to Elvis Spicer and Mary (Cheater) Seat. He enlisted early with the permission of his mother into the United States Army and then into the United States Navy. Mr. Spicer worked at the Seneca Indian School in Wyandotte and then in the maintenance department for Miami Public Schools and was also a proud member of the Seneca-Cayuga Tribe. He is preceded in passing by his parents Elvis and Mary, two sons Doug NoEar and George White Horn, a brother Chris Spicer and two sisters Maxine Williams and Irene Johnson.
