William Haigh Fullerton, 56, of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, passed away Thursday, March 23, 2023 at Integris Baptist Medical Center in Oklahoma City.

Bill was born May 17, 1966 in Miami, Oklahoma, to Priscilla (Cook) and Samuel C. Fullerton III. He graduated from Miami High School in 1984 and the University of Oklahoma in 1992 with a Bachelor of Business Administration. He also obtained his private pilot's license while a student at OU. Bill was a long-time employee at 180 Medical in Oklahoma City.

Bill was a lifelong motorcycle enthusiast and pursued his passion for racing and speed even following his tragic motorcycle accident in 1988 which left him a quadriplegic. He continued to enjoy adaptive bicycling, kayaking, water skiing, snow skiing and most recently a high-performance electric trike until his various challenges prevented him from pursuing his adrenaline filled interests. Above all, he loved to watch motocross on Saturday nights. Bill was an example and encourager to many in the handicapped community and beyond with his indomitable spirit and determination to live life to the fullest. His positive attitude, contagious smile, and quick wit will be missed by all who knew him.

Bill is survived by his brother Sam Fullerton and wife Jami of Tulsa; sister Anne Browne and husband Wade of Dallas; nephew Wade Browne and wife Kelsey, Nieces Helen Fullerton, Hailey Leigh and husband Billy, Margaret Browne and husband Stefan Tangen, Rebecca Browne, and Laney Browne. He is also survived by his Aunt Judith Fullerton and husband Ward Chapman, Aunt Ann Wright, and cousins Sarah Chapman, Genevieve Stiefvater, and Thomas Fields.

He was preceded in death by his parents Priscilla and Samuel C. Fullerton III.
