Zelma Rose Rawlings was born September 27, 1927 near Cabool, Missouri to the late Henry J. and Gladys V. (Lewis) Greuter. She passed away Sunday, July 8, 2012 in Miami at the age of 84. She worked for many years as a beautician. Zelma was a life member of the D.A.V., American Legion and V.F.W. and president of the Ladies Auxiliary to the V.F.W. for 51 years. She was also a member of the Miami Pilot Club. She greatly enjoyed community service, serving Meals on Wheels and assisting veterans, especially those that were hospitalized. She was president of V.F.W. Post 8542 Auxiliary of Welch for 30 years. She also organized Post 2592 of Bernice, 8380 of Grove, 2745 of Nowata, 3573 of Locust Grove and 5307 of Salina. Zelma also served as the State Color Bearer for 16 years, Deputy Chief of State and All State District President for 6 years. She remained active until her death, especially helping hospitalized veterans. Zelma was a member of the First Christian Church of Miami.

Zelma was preceded in death by her parents, husband, Jack Rawlings, brothers, Eugene and Cecil Greuter and a step-daughter, Linda Vanetta

Survivors include her three brothers, Melvin Greuter of Willow Springs, Missouri, Bob Greuter of Freeman, Missouri and Gary Greuter of Blue Springs, Missouri, five sisters, Aleeta Kanies of Independence, Missouri, Donnie McClenahan and Bonnie Bowlin, both of Grandview, Missouri and Sharon Dudley and Shirley Wetekamp of Willow Springs, Missouri and many nieces and nephews.
